

Love And Marriage (IX)

Marriage: Partnership of the whole of life

In Christian Marriage, the man and woman establish between themselves a Partnership of the whole of life. At the time of giving their consent in the marriage, each of the spouses pledge their whole of life to the other spouse. The word "Partnership" is derived from the Roman legal system and has some connotation of 'contract' with rights and obligations protected by legal system. Hence, during the codification of the Canon Law 1983, the



term suggested was "Communion" instead of 'Partnership" as the former term is used by Vatican Council II as well as Pope Saint John Paul II in 'Familiaris consortio' 1982. Because 'Communion' was more theological where each of the spouses pledge their whole heart and mind to the other spouse. However, in the final draft the term "Partnership" was approved because in marriage apart from the theological aspect, the legal protection of rights and obligations is required. Hence, the term 'partnership' connotes both. When the spouses establish partnership between themselves, they pledging their whole self (mind, body, soul, heart, spiritual, emotional, psychological, etc), and the same is protected by legal system against repeated violation of the partnership by the non-committed spouse.

'Partnership' of the whole of life in marriage is not to be confused with partnership for business purpose. In the business partnership, the partners pledge only one or more aspect/s of their relationship as the business demands and they can withdraw their commitment at will depending upon the agreement. But in marriage, 'partnership' includes community of the persons who share a common lot. It underscores that the spouses' destinies are inextricably intertwined 'in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health'. Hence, once committed, they cannot withdraw. Therefore, for a fruitful marriage, the spouses must have sufficient knowledge of what the Christian marriage entails vis-à-vis the partnership of the whole of their life.

Let us surrender the married couples and those intending to marry in the hands of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

Origin and brief history on Our Lady of Mount Carmel

riting a religious article becomes so much difficult, when your personal knowledge on the subject is limited to hand down tales repeated by elders at home or in the village square during the celebration of a particular feast of a church or otherwise. Considering today's India and the fables dished out in the name of truth by the narrative around, it was only right to research on the subject more for me than for others to understand the significance of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel is a name used by the Carmelite Order. The Order origins go back to the 12th Century, when a group of Christian hermits chose to settle in the caves of Mount Carmel located in the holy land, inspired by Prophet Elias. There they built a chapel and dedicated it to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mount Carmel is still perceived as the Carmelites spiritual center. They have socially accepted to live a life in total service of the poor and sick.

The feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel is celebrated on July 16, on the day of her apparitions to Simon Stock (Now accepted as a Saint).

During the vision, she revealed to him the Scapular, popularly known as the Brown Scapular(The Scapular is made of two small pieces of brown woolen cloth connected by two strings).Our Lady appeared in the company of angels, bearing the Infant Jesus in her arms and holding the Brown Scapular.

The Scapular signifies to the world a special sign of her favor. Those who die clothed with this habit shall be preserved from eternal fire. It is a badge of salvation, a shield in time of danger. Anyone wearing it piously will not suffer eternal damnation.

On the 3rd of March in 1322, Pope John XXII had a vision whereby our lady appeared to him to grant a Sabbatine privilege to the souls of those who wore the Scapular till death. Mother Mary promised to descend to Purgatory on the Saturday after their death

and free their souls if found there

Many miracles are attributed to both Mother Mary and the Brown Scapular in lay people's life.

The Carmelites, from a heritage beginning in a cave, have spread all over the world including a significant presence in Goa, in the form of different churches/Convents and Schools built far and wide dedicated in her honor: The most famous being the first Church/Chapel of Capela da Nossa Senhora do Monte, in Old Goa, built in 1510-1519 immediately after the Portuguese conquest of Goa. Closer to that is the famous Ruins of the Convent and Church in Ribandar. Our lady of Mount Carmel Church, Arambol is another one reconstructed in 1841 just to name a few.

The feast celebrates the devotion that the Blessed Virgin Mary shows to those who are devoted and signal that devotion by wearing the brown Scapular. According to tradition, those who wear the scapular faithfully will be granted grace and protection from any harm, protection from dangerous situation and deliverance from purgatory.

n the 11th of June, The Diocesan Pastoral Secretariat along with the Diocesan Pastoral Council organised a Pastoral Enrichment Programme for the Central Zone PPC members at the St Joseph Vaz Spiritual Renewal Centre, Old Goa .The Central zone included the Ponda deanery, Panjim deanery, Goa Velha deanery and the Old Goa deanery.

The programme began at 09.30am with a Eucharistic Celebration by Fr Henry Falcao, Director of SJVSRC, The homily enriched the importance of "The Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ", being the feast day of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

To make the Pastoral Councils more effective instruments of pastoral action in their parish, the 1st session was on explanation of the pastoral letter of the Archbishop for the pastoral year 2023-24. Fr Henry Falcao in his aim to help the members to grow in faith as lay leaders left no stone unturned .He began with the introduction of the letter putting forward the question what is the dream of the Church of the third millennium? And expressing the answer it is to become a "Synodal Church".

Further he explained the pastoral theme of the year 2023-24" You also should do as I have done to you" that the lay leaders should reflect on this command of Jesus. Explaining the main body of the letter with questions what did the Master do? What type of a leader He was, and going through the answers the one who goes in search of people, who had a passion for His mission, whose leadership was inclusive, transforming and life giving. He collected data from PPC members with a questionnaire which will help the secretariat to understand various challenges faced, the strengths and lastly the practical tips and suggestions for implementation which the members pen down.

The programme ended with sharing a meal together as one Body of Christ by 2.00pm.

Old Goa- Cradle Of Indian Carmel

Lay br. John Marshal of S. Mary Magdalene & Mission in the Kingdom of the Pandyas

Id Goa is the Rome of the Orient and a City of Saints. Indeed, the chapter on Christianity in the East cannot be complete without Old Goa. She is the mother of Christian virtues in the Orient. Such a spiritual city is also the home of the first ever Carmelite presence in India.

Almost all Goan Catholics are aware of the Scapular devotion (Bentin) as well as Our Lady of Mount Carmel. However, few of us are aware of the fact that this devotion was FIRST introduced in Old Goa and from here spread to all over India. Following the footsteps of the reform of St. Teresa of Avila, the first women doctor of the Church and mystic, her sons came to Persia (Iran) in 1604. However, being a Muslim country how can they get enough vocations and funds for their sustenance? Goa seemed a viable option for them.

Miracle of Cruz dos Milagros & St. Teresa of Avila: Their petition to establish their convent in Old Goa was rejected because they were from Italian congregation and not from Portugal. The Carmelite Fr. Leandro from Spain came specifically for this purpose and Our Lord answered their prayers through the MIRACULOUS CROSS-CRUZ DOS MILAGROS. The apparition took place on 1619 and the archbishop D. Cristovao de Lisboa ordered a procession from Cruz dos Milagros to our Se' Cathedral. In that procession, Fr. Leandro placed a statue of St. Teresa of Avila and when it came to the archbishop to be blessed, he found a note in the hand of the saint which read "Please give my sons a place in your city". The archbishop who was a devotee of S. Teresa was moved to tears and, on the spot, he issued the license. Thus, the first Carmelite convent of India was established on 25th April, 1620 and it was dedicated to the Mother of God.

Making of the First Goan Bishop: The Carmelite Fr. Leandro played a key role in forming the ever first native bishop of Goa as well as the first Indian bishop of the Latin rite- D. Matheus de Castro from Divar. He was not admitted to priesthood by the

Portuguese. Therefore, he contacted Fr. Leandro who sent him to the Carmelites in Persia. From there the Carmelites sent him to Rome and introduced him to the Propaganda Fide who were impressed with our Castro. He was about to be ordained but lost his papers. But, Venerable.Fr. Prosper of the Holy Spirit- restorer of Mt. Carmel made the necessary documents and finally he was ordained a priest and later a bishop and sent as a Vicar Apostolic to India. Sadly, the Portuguese never accepted him as their equal. But it was Bishop Castro who first made a conspiracy of revolt against the Portuguese to liberate Goa from the foreign rule way back in 1650's.

Old Goa gave the First Martyrs of the Worldwide Discalced Carmelite Order: The Discalced Carmelites follow the reform of St. Teresa of Avila. The very first martyrs of this order namely BLESED. DENIS & REDEMPTUS professed in Old Goa, lived here and finally gave their lives for Christ in Achen, Indonesia in 1638. They were the members of the Old Goa Carmelite convent.

Bl. Denis- Protector of Goa: Blessed Denis, who was originally from France was a soldier and a cartographer before becoming a Carmelite. In 1636, Dutch were blocking Old Goa and laid siege on the city. At that time, the Portuguese asked Bl. Denis to lead the army and he marched towards the Dutch, engaged in a battle with them and conquered them and thus protected Old Goa.

First Frenchman in Pondicherry? No! It's in the Carmelite Convent, Old Goa: Often when we think of the French presence in India, we might immediately think about Pondicherry. The very first person sent by the French to establish French East India company in India was Ian Bebber who took great initiatives in establishing a French factory in Surat. Owing to internal dissensions, he fled to Goa and nothing was known about him after that. However, when in 2019 when we cleared the Convent site, we found a tomb in the altar and deciphered it and came to know that he died in the Carmelite convent, Old Goa in 1669. Therefore, the remains of the first person who took efforts to establish French east India company lies in Old Goa.

<u>Church in Kerala was changed by the Carmelites from Old</u> <u>Goa:</u> During the 16-17th centuries the Church in Kerala was under the Portuguese and Jesuits too charge of their affairs greatly. In 1642, two Carmelites from Old Goa convent went to Kuruvilangad-



a centre of St. Thomas Christians in Kerala and established a confraternity of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel there. The leader of the St. Thomas Christians was greatly impressed by the Carmelites and he petitioned to the Pope for the Carmelites instead of the Jesuits. The request was granted and from 1657 onwards was established the Malabar mission of the Carmelites. The Carmelites practically governed the Church of Kerala until the 20th century.

A Carmelite Nephew of Pope in Old Goa: Pope Innocent XII was the Pope from 1691-1700. His nephew was Fr. Peter Paul of S. Francis who was the superior of the Carmelite convent- Old Goa between 1682-87. Fr. Peter Paul was also made as the first titular Archbishop of Ancyra- the current capital of Turkey.

Old Goa- a place touched by many Carmelite saints: Apart from Bl. Denis and Remeptus we have these saintly Carmelites who visited Old Goa: Venerable John Vincent of Jesus and Mary-Spanish Carmelite who came to venerate our Goencho Saiba-St. Francis Xavier in 1900; venerable Aureliano of the Blessed Sacrament who organized Eucharist Congress in Old Goa in 1900. Servant of God- Archbishop Aloysius Maria Benziger who played a crucial role in re-establishing Carmelite life in Goa. Apart from them, Bl. Mary Josephine of Jesus Crucified - an Italian Carmelite nun was a great devotee of our Goencho Saiba and she was delivered from angina, tuberculosis of spine etc. through our Saiba. She became bedridden and was bound to a wheelchair for

almost 10 years. However, when a relic of our Saiba touched her, she immediately got up and our Saiba appeared to her in her dream and blessed her. We can relate here our Lord healing a woman who was crippled for 18 years. (Luke 13: 10-17).

Love for Konkani: Carmelite Bishop Francis Xavier of St. Anne, vicar of Sunkery- Karwar wrote a scholarly Konkani grammar in the 18th century. He was one among the first to establish that Konkani is closely related to Marathi rather than Kannada. In the recent times, the saintly late. Fr. Anastasio Gomes from the Carmelite convent- Margao was a promoter of Romi Konkani. Pray that his cause of canonization may be opened soon.

First Native Carmelite Congregation: The first ever native Carmelite congregation in the whole of Asia was the Tertiary Carmelites of Chimbel (18-19th centuries). It was composed of all native ethnic Goans.

Conclusion: From Old Goa Carmelites went to Karwar (1700) and from there appointed as the Bishops of Bombay from 1720 until 1841. From Old Goa Carmelites went to Kerala (1642) and gradually this presence gave birth to the all-Indigenous Carmelites in the whole of India today. Dioceses of Belgaum and Pune in its initial years were cradled by the Carmelites from Goa. Thus, Old Goa- Rome of the Orient is the cradle for the Carmelite life in the whole of India.
