The month of May is general considered, among the Catholics, as an important month dedicated to Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Jesus and our Heavenly Mother. Keeping this in mind, various religious activities and festivities are celebrated during this month such as Litany of Our Lady, Feasts of Holy Cross and also of the Blessed Virgin Mary in each of the *Somudai*, the processions of the Bl. V. Mary, and family/community Rosary. In addition, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Three Necessities on 31st May. Further, we have installed our new Parish Pastoral Council and Parish Pastoral Assembly who will begin their ministry from this month of May 2024.

The devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, which is expressed through the various religious and pious activities as mentioned above, is intrinsic to Christian worship. It aims at not only **(a) to honour the Most Blessed Virgin Mary** who stated that “All generation will call me blessed” (Lk. 1: 48) but also **(b) endows the faithful to grant true adoration/worship to God**. The special devotion rendered to Bl. V. Mary essentially differs from the adoration which is given to the Incarnate Word (Jesus) and equally to the Father and the Holy Spirit. Nevertheless, our devotion to Mary greatly fosters the adoration to the Triune God as She assists the faithful to in the act.

The Marian prayers especially the Holy Rosary which is an “epitome of the whole Gospel” (Vat. II, SC. 103) are **(c) fundamentally communitarian**; and **(d) oriented towards eschatology**, that is of a Church who makes the pilgrimage of faith to the homeland at the end of the earthly journey. **The communitarian aspect of the devotion** is evident when we observe the family, *somudai* or parish community gathering

together to celebrate the festivity/prayer. They not only pull their resources and common prayers but also share their life with each other after the example of Mother Mary. **Another phase of the communitarian devotion is co-participation in the Mission of Christ especially at the parish level.** This is done, in our parish, mainly through the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) and Parish Pastoral Assembly (PPA). With immense joy, we thank God for giving us wonderful and enthusiastic members of the above mentioned Church bodies. While I express my deep gratitude to the MET members, the outgoing PPC and CAT members, the ward leaders who served voluntarily and to all the parishioners for having participated and cooperated in the process of forming the new PPC and PPA, I congratulate the new PPC and PPA members and pray that God may, through the powerful intercession of the Bl. V. Mary, grant them the necessary graces to collaborate and bring to fruition their joint mission. In the same spirit, the outgoing PPC/CAT are expected to cooperate and provide sufficient assistance to the new PPC/PPA in fulfilling their God given mission in the parish. In this way **by working together, the true honour can be given to the Blessed Virgin Mary** and worthy Christian worship and adoration can be rendered to the Blessed Trinity.

The above devotion and worship will lead us to the fourth step, which is the eschatological dimension. Just as the Bl. V. Mary participated in the salvific mission of Christ and after her earthly sojourn was taken body and soul in heaven, the Church (in this parish, we the parishioners) after our participation in the mission of Christ, will shine forth His values on earth, and face the difficulties with hope and comfort of the pilgrim people of God until the day of the Lord shall come.

Tiche khaxele gunn: Mog, Bhavarth ani Bhovanso aplea jivitant onbhovunk tancho kherit anvddo.

Itihasant mellta tea pormonem hi Tin gorzachi Saibinnichi Imaj khub xekddea poilim Our Lady of Luz hea igorjent asli. The Right to Vote

The right to Vote is a fundamental right of every adult in any democratic society. The Indian Constitution as per article 326; ensures our right to vote at the age of 18 years onwards from the previous 21 years. The right to vote is not just a privilege, but a basic human right, voting allows citizen the right to political participation; to express their preference, values and beliefs in choosing their respective representative, Voting allows citizens to hold their elected candidate accountable for their



actions, voting can be a powerful tool for social change and promote equality, justice and progress in society, by voting citizens can safeguard their civil liberties, such as freedom of speech, assembly and religion. A right vote to a deserving candidate will shape how our country progresses towards growth.

However, voting rights have evolved over a period of time, many countries gradually expanding suffrage. A brief history to understand, how privileged, we in India have been to have got this right to vote, soon after our independence in 1950.

- In ancient Greece, where first voting is recorded in history, only male citizens who owned property or wealthy class were allowed to vote.
- In United Kingdom an empire spread around the world, only in 1928 equality between men and women was achieved, when the age was lowered to match that of men 21 and above, before all women above 30 years only were allowed to vote.

- In U.S.A., considered one of the biggest democracy, the right to vote was initially limited to white male property owners. In 1870, Black men were first allowed to vote following the 15th amendment, while the women were granted the right to vote in 1920.

Sadly, the right to vote has remain a bone of contention with corruption and manipulation, illiteracy remains our biggest challenge, educating our vast population and drumming the value of his/her vote is very important. Today, we have reached a state where elections are fought on the basis of religion, race, caste or sex.

Today, elections need a clean up and **only by using your right to vote wisely** can this be done, if not, the words of Winston Churchill, the British Prime Minister will keep on echoing a constant reminder, when he said; *“Power will go to the hands of rascals, rogues, freebooters. They will have sweet tongues and silly hearts. They will fight amongst themselves for power and India will be lost in political squabbles.”*

Report of the Inaugural of Parish Pastoral Council (2024-27)

The inaugural mass of the newly constituted Parish Pastoral Council (2024-27) was held on 21st April, 2024 at 7:30 am. The mass on the theme, 'In the footsteps of Jesus, let us strengthen communion, promote participation and continue His mission', was presided over by Parish Priest, Fr. Rosario Oliveira along with Fr. Seby Vaz. The mass began with the solemn procession of the newly elected PPC members along with the priests. Dwelling on the theme of the good shepherd, Fr. Rosario in his homily exhorted the PPC members to work unitedly in the footsteps of Jesus with a forgiving and understanding spirit despite differences, difficulties and challenges that may be encountered.



At the mass, Fr. Rosario announced the names of the members and those present stood and responded to affirm their presence. The decree received from Diocesan Pastoral Secretariat for the reconstitution of PPC was read by Fr. Rosario. Then, with lit candles, the new members took an oath, pledging their service as PPC members.



After a group photo of the members with the priests after mass, the members gathered in the parish hall. A meeting was held in the parish hall to conduct the election of new Executive Committee Members (ExCo) of the newly formed Parish Pastoral Council. Two delegates-Mr. Eurico Noronha and Ms. Tina Furtado deputed by the Diocesan Pastoral Secretariat as observers were present both for the mass and the meeting.



Ms. Clea Souza welcomed the gathering and the DPS delegates. She requested the delegates to introduce themselves.

After the self-introduction, the delegates then took over the proceedings along with MET, comprising of Rovina Fernandes, Savio Vaz, Christopher D’Cunha, Clea Souza and Belinda D’Mello. (Team who are not part of PPC)

Mr. Eurico announced the names from the final list of members and marked the attendance. The total number of members of the new council who were present and eligible for voting were 42. The MET displayed the names of those eligible to be voted for on the screen. Those not eligible to be voted for included the ex-officio members, representatives of catechetical apostolate, Parish Youth group and liturgical animators. MET member, Savio, explained the roles of a Moderator, Vice Moderator, Secretary and Joint Secretary with the help of power point presentation. The observers appreciated the role of MET in preparing the power point presentation on roles of the ExCo. The process and rules of election were well explained by Mr. Eurico.

Mr. Eurico then conducted a short prayer service invoking God’s grace and blessings in the light of the Word of God.

According to suggestions by the observers, nominations were invited for the posts of Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Secretary and Joint-Secretary from among the eligible members. 12 names were proposed and these names were written on the board.

The first was election to the post of Moderator. Each of the 42 members cast their vote by writing name of a preferred candidate and dropping in the ballot box. The votes were then counted by the MET in the presence of the observers who recorded the same as each vote was read out loudly.



The highest number of votes were bagged by **Mr. Lloyd Vaz**, who was declared as **Moderator** of the new PPC.

For the post of **Vice Moderator** votes were cast for the remaining 11 proposed names. **Mr. Menino Menezes** was declared as the **Vice Moderator** as he got the maximum votes.

For the post of Secretary, votes were cast for the remaining 10 proposed names. The candidate getting the highest vote, **Ms. Rhea Mascarenhas**, was declared as the **Secretary** of the new Council. Elections were then held to the post of Joint Secretary. **Mrs. Shrutika Gaudé** was declared elected to the post of **Joint Secretary** on the basis of the highest vote tally.

The newly elected EXCo members along with Treasurer, Fabrica, Mr. Anil Afonso, jointly read the oath pledging their dedicated services in accordance with the roles assigned to them. The election process was then declared as complete by the observers.

Parish Priest, Fr. Rosario Oliveira, expressed his gratitude to the DPS observers for their role in the successful conduct of the election. He also commended and appreciated the MET team for their valuable contribution throughout the period of the reconstitution process. He congratulated the new team and wished them the very best in their new responsibilities.



The meeting ended at 11:00 am with final blessings by Fr. Rosario.

When You Visit A Priest, Please Remember...

That a priest isn't married, nor will he have a family of his own. No wife, no children. His family is his parishioners. He is a spiritual father in faith to the community he serves. His future is in celebrating the Eucharist at mass every day, listening to confessions, anointing the sick, serving those who come to him for help. A priest may serve a parish only for a minimum of five to seven years. After that he may be transferred to another parish or assigned a different role in the Church. He relies on his team of volunteers, staff and the lay faithful. Don't expect him to be there all the time for you.

When you give money to the Church, you may be surprised to know that the money isn't for him because no priest earns a fixed salary. They receive a stipend to meet their basic expenses of food, clothing and travel. They save every penny to go for a vacation and much of the money is gifted by friends, relatives and well wishers as they don't get paid leave like the rest of us who work.

While we work for a fixed amount of hours with two days off a week, priests are expected to be on stand by 24/7. So don't be angry if they don't respond to you when you need them. They are humans as well with the same frailty as us.

If you hear anyone speaking badly about a particular priest, please correct that person and don't engage in idle gossip without knowing the facts. Remember that they are alone and at times would need company. Pay attention to their emotional, physical and mental needs. Accompany them if needed or offer a helping hand or even a lift. It's not easy to go out alone at 2 or 3 in the morning especially in dangerous neighborhoods for counseling or even anointing someone on their death bed. If someone comes to them at such an hour for help, they have to get up from their deep sleep and still be expected to celebrate Mass in the morning. Who is there for them when they are ill or have emergencies in the middle of the night? Yet they are required to perform their duties because if not them, who?

Remember their birthdays, ordination anniversaries and important events in their lives. Celebrate with them, cry with them. Offer a shoulder to lean on. If they fall, don't judge or criticize. Lift them up and help them on their journey in life. Don't be offended if they don't live up to your expectations. No priest is perfect.

So take care of your priests, remember the ones who baptized, confirmed, married and anointed you. The ones who offer masses for your intentions and pray for you. May God bless our priests in Jesus name, our eternal High Priest. Amen.
