Kaitu : Ago Santu, where were you for so many days? And even now you seem so pale. Is everything alright?

Santu: Hoi Kaitu, I was not keeping well. I had fever and cold. It was so terrible. I visited the doctor also, but I am still not recovering. So many tablets, vaz ailo mhaka.

Kaitu: Yes, sometimes these tablets and syrups don't work.

Listen to me, you better try some home remedies. I'll tell you some few, you can try and see if its helping you to recover. There are no side effects of these medicines, but just take care not to take too much of it.

Santu : yes yes please tell me, I hope this at least helps.

Kaitu: So try, lemon. Dilute one lemon in a glass of warm water, also add a teaspoon of honey to it. Mix well and consume it. It should be taken once or twice daily.

Santu: Ohh, I know Lemons have vitamin—C which helps to increase body resistance. In that case consuming orange juice will also help.

Kaitu: Hoi sarkhem. Ginger is another good food for cold. Take around 10 grams of ginger or a medium piece, cut into small pieces and boil in a cup of water. Stain it and add half a teaspoon of suger to it. Drink this decoction when hot. This can be taken twice in a day.

Santu : ohh okay. I had also read somewhere that garlic and ginger soup with a teaspoon onion juice is an effective remedy for cold.

Kaitu: Yes correct. Turmeric is also an effective remedy for cold and throat irritation. Half a teaspoon of turmeric powder mixed in 30 ml of warm milk, and this must be

taken twice daily. The milk should be boiled in turmeric on slow fire.

Santu : Ohh really, that is nice. What about remedy for fever?

Kaitu: There is, Holi Basil, *Tulsi*. Prepare decoction of about 12 gms *tulsi* leaves in half litre of water. It can be consumed twice daily with half cup of milk, one teaspoon of sugar or simply consumed as decoction. It will help to bring down temperature.

Santu : Yes *tulsi* is useful for lot of other ailments too.

Kaitu: not just this, but raisins also help in lowering temperature. Soak around 25 raisins in half cup of water and then crushing them in the same water. Strain it and discard the skin. If half a spoon of lime water is added to this acts as medicine for fever. It should be taken twice daily.

Santu: Wow. You have so much knowledge of home remedies, have you studied to be a doctor or what? Ha ha ha...

Kaitu: No no. my grandparents taught me these. And this is what helps me to recover every time. You too give it a try and let me know if it works for you. Get well soon. And take care.

Santu : yes definitely. Thank you. I will share this with others too, so that they too can benefit from it.

In Goa the feast is called "Monti Fest", it is a major family celebration serving as a thanksgiving festival blessing the harvest of new crops. It is also called Children's feast, as children comes with flowers in their hands offering them on Baby Mary's statue.




Feast of Assumption and Independence Day Celebration

Exaltation of the Cross

ccording to the Christian liturgical calendar the feast of the Exaltation of the cross on which Jesus Christ was crucified is celebrated on 14th September every year. This recalls the three events namely the discovery of the True cross by St. Helena (The mother of Emperor Constantine), the dedication of churches built by Emperor Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary.

Earlier in the 7th century in the Gallican Usage, the feast of the cross was celebrated on 3rd May and called 'Cross mass' but when the Gallican and Roman practices combined, Pope John xxIII assigned 14th September as a date to commemorate the rescue of the cross from the Sassanid Persians.

The cross probably originated with the Assyrians and Babylonians. The earlier Christians accepted the cross as 'Gallows' on which Jesus Christ was crucified, but in the 4th century after Emperor Constantine converted himself to Christianity, he abolished crucifixion as a death



penalty and considered the cross as the UNIVERSAL symbol of Christianity. In the early centuries symbols such as a fish, a dove, a ship, an anchor, and a lyre were being used.

The cross thus is a sign of salvation, both of the Christ himself and of the faith of Christians. When Jesus died on the cross he took on himself the sins of all who would believe in him. Christ's death on the cross is believed to be 'completed' by God's raising him from the dead three days later. The resurrection was a sign of Christ's 'victory' over sin and death.

The cross also teaches us about forgiveness, where the power of sin can be destroyed and the power to work above sin can be obtained. Jesus died and rose from the dead likewise our old nature must die so that we can live as a brand new creation in life. St. Paul profoundly said "I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me".

The cross that Jesus was crucified was made out of Dogwood tree and was about 7-9 feet tall and the patibulum on which Jesus' arms were stretched was about 5-6 ft long, the total weight of the cross was believed to be over 300 pounds. Jesus carried the cross and walked about 0.5 - 0.80 km for almost 1-3 hours stopping several times, until he was finally crucified at a place called «The Skull».

The objective of the stations of the cross that are held during the Lenten season every year is to help the Christian faithful to make a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the passion and death of Christ symbolizing the actual path Jesus walked to mount Calvary.

Jesus' last words before he breathed his last breath were "It is finished". The title placed on the cross of Jesus "INRI" which means Jesus of Nazareth, The King of the Jews which was an official charge levied against Jesus by Pontius Pilate. The only disciple who stood at the foot of the cross throughout to witness the Lord's death was "John the Evangelist" (Jesus' favorite disciple). Jesus' reason for surrendering to the cross was to save his followers from suffering a similar fate.

The feast of the Holy cross is celebrated in our church on the 14th of September preceded by 3 days' novenas called the 'Tridum'. This cross has an unique history of its inception. In 1835 when the king of Portugal suppressed all religious orders and congregations at 'Cruz dos Milagros', the Oratorians residing there were forced to vacate the place. It was then, that the Governor Jose Ferreira Pestanha ordered that the Miracolous cross be transferred to the 'Se Cathedral' . Thus on 3rd May 1845 this miraculous cross was brought to Se Cathedral in a solemn procession by the then Archbishop Silva Torres from the church of 'Our Lady of Light' situated at 'Cruz Dos Milagros' which no longer exists today.

Although our parish celebrates the feast of this cross on the 14th of September every year, but the renovated church and newly constructed spiritual renewal center which stands at the sight of the miracle, celebrates the feast on the 23rd of February every year, commemorating the day of the miracle that took place on this hillock in the year 1619.

In our daily life, to carry your cross means to fully put all your trust in God amid the storms and battles in your life.

This is true Christianity.


